PA Harvest of the Month

Our PA Harvest of the Month for June is Strawberries. Did you know that there are 200 seeds in a strawberry? Did you know that strawberries are the only fruit with seeds on the outside? When enjoying strawberries at home, they may remain in dry storage for up to 24 hours. If keeping strawberries in the refrigerator, they may be kept in the refrigerator at temperatures below 41 degrees for up to 3 days or up to 2 weeks if the temperature is 32 degrees with a humidity of 95%. Strawberries are an excellent source for Vitamin C.

Sunscreen Safety

Sun Safety is our monthly safety topic for June. Sunscreen should be applied to skin at least 30 minutes prior to going outside. Classrooms often go outside in the morning and the afternoon. It is best practice to send your child to school with sunscreen applied. Teachers will reapply as needed before splash day and afternoon outdoor time.

At LifeSpan, we have permission slips to fill out at the front desk to permit the teachers to apply sunscreen at school. All sunscreen that comes to school should have a label with the child's first and last name on this form. Sunscreen should NOT be placed in a child's bag as staff are required to keep sunscreen out of reach of children for safety. Be sure to check the expiration date of the sunscreen. If sunscreen appears to change in color or consistency, it is time to replace.
