September's Tip of the Month: 13 tips for the first day of daycare

Child care and child development experts share their best tips for a smooth first day of daycare (for your child and you!).

Starting daycare is a major transition in any child's life. For some, it's the first time they've ever been away from their parents for a significant amount of time and the first time they've ever interacted with such a large group of other children. For others, it may not be their first child care experience, but they might be adjusting to a new teacher, center or in-home daycare. When you're starting your kids at a new daycare, one of the most important things you can do is prepare them for the major changes ahead.

We asked Katrina Macaset, a child development expert and content specialist for Zero to Three; Traci Sanders, a family child care provider and author of "Right At Home: A Parent's Guide to Choosing Quality Child Care"; and Arika Molitor, a Texas child care worker with daycare experience, to share their best tips for a great first day of daycare.

1. Visit before your first day
2. Talk about the new routine
3. Make changes to their sleep schedule
4. Practice independence
5. Have a date night
6. Get them excited
7. Pack like a pro
8. Label everything
9. Bring a comfort item
10. Give yourself extra time
11. Make a plan with your child
12. Resist the urge to linger
13. Be patient
